**Scott County Central Online Learning Guidelines and Expectations**

- This is a summary of the guidelines and expectations. Additional information may be found in the COVID-19 District Re-Entry Plan.
- The district is not required to provide students access to or pay for courses beyond the equivalent of full-time enrollment.
- **Registration deadlines will be strictly enforced unless the superintendent or designee determines that an exception is warranted due to circumstances such as a change in a student's health or the long-term suspension of a student.**
- Students taking courses virtually are subject to district policies, procedures and rules applicable to students enrolled in traditional courses including, but not limited to, the district's discipline code and prohibitions on academic dishonesty, discrimination, harassment, bullying and cyberbullying.
- Students enrolled in virtual courses are expected to actively participate in those courses with the goal of completing the course.
- Students enrolled in virtual courses are expected to complete all course requirements in the time allotted for the course.
- Students enrolled in SCC Online Learning will be required to maintain this enrollment for the duration of first semester. A similar requirement will be in place for the second semester.
- Students will continue to participate in the district benchmark assessments including the Missouri Assessment Program (MAP) and other classroom assessments as needed throughout the school year.
- Participation in SCC Online Learning requires a reliable wi-fi connection for video conferencing not provided by the District.
- Younger children will likely need family support logging in, some supervision while online and potential trouble-shooting.
- Secondary students enrolling in SCC Online Learning may not be able to access previously selected courses for the 2020-2021 school year. If alternate courses are necessary, school counselors will work directly with the student/ family.
